Cost-of-Living Comparisons for PAC-12 Schools

The **Living wage** is a model for measuring the hourly rate you must earn if you are the sole provider and working full time. The Living Wage is defined as the wage needed to cover <u>basic</u> family expenses plus all relevant taxes. Basic expenses calculated include food, housing, child care, insurance premiums and healthcare costs, transportation, taxes, and other necessities.

The **Minimum Wage** is established by federal, state, and local governments to indicate the lowest wage an employer may legally pay their workers. States can set their minimum wage higher than the federal minimum.
