Financing Your Education

WSU is dedicated to helping provide financial support for graduate students. As a matter of fact, the majority of full-time Ph.D. students at WSU receive financial support. Many students receive a graduate student assistantship, which often comes with a tuition waiver. There are three types of assistantships available:

Graduate Teaching Assistantship (GTA)

The GTA may assist faculty in teaching undergraduate courses and labs, grading examinations, problem sets or lab assignments, setting up, preparing for or maintaining laboratory equipment.

Graduate Research Assistant (GRA)

The GRA conducts academically significant research under the direction of a faculty member who is generally a principal investigator on a grant or contract.

Graduate Staff Assistant (GSA)

The GSA provides academic and administrative program support such as academic advising, program planning, and assisting with the administration of student services offices.

Fellowships, Scholarships, Grants and Contracts

Health Care

On-Campus Medical Clinic and Pharmacy

Students have access to a range of health services at our outpatient medical clinic located on campus. Our physicians are board certified with expertise in college health. The pharmacy is conveniently located inside the clinic.

Medical and dental plans are available to certain graduate student assistants as a benefit. Talk with your appointing department to determine your eligibility, or visit studentinsurance.wsu.edu.

Health Care Services for Spouses and Partners of Graduate/Professional Students

WSU's PASS Program enables spouses and partners of eligible graduate and professional students to access medical services and health care providers available at Health and Wellness Services. The PASS program is not an insurance plan.

Child Care

Medical Leave

Medical Leave is a program for students who must leave school for up to one calendar year due to a medical condition. Students on approved medical leave do not have to reenroll at the end of leave.

Short-term Parental Leave Plan

This plan allows up to four consecutive weeks of leave for the period directly before or after the birth or adoption of a child. During this time the student continues to be enrolled, and if on an assistantship appointment (academic year only), will continue to receive tuition waivers, health benefits, and salary.

Childcare Resource and Referral

Trained parent counselors are here to help you with your parent questions and concerns and provide you with a variety of information and services for families. Assistance includes locating childcare providers in Pullman, information about quality care for children, childcare checklists, help determining subsidized care eligibility, and how to locate in-home caregivers. wsu.edu/CCRR.

Children's Center

WSU's Children's Center serves WSU students, faculty and staff for children age 6 weeks through 12 years. Developmentally appropriate learning environment advocated by the National Association for the Education of Young Children; trained professionals in child care; and a team approach. childrenscenter.wsu.edu.

Evening Childcare

The Children's Center offers evening care Monday through Thursday from 5:30 to 9:30 p.m. for families who have children enrolled at the Center. There is a cost of \$5 for per child per night for graduate students who use the Graduate and Professional Student Association Subsidy. Eveningcare.childrenscenter.wsu.edu

Community Child Care Center
