

Q1 - Why did you apply for admission to Washington State University?(Select all that apply)






Q2 - Were you invited to WSU for a campus visit?






Q3 - If yes, which campus visit did you attend?





Q4 - When you were exploring WSU, who did you talk with? (Select all that apply)









Q5 - If you spoke to someone in the Graduate School, what was your experience?







Q6 - If you spoke with someone in a department, what was your experience?






Q7 - If you spoke with a faculty member, what was your experience?

Interviewing with WSU was a wonderful experience. It only made me more interested in the program. It was a difficult decision choosing between WSU and the school I am attending currently.

The funding (an assistantship and \$1000 fellowship bonus) was just not competitive and the students who were applying for jobs when I came to visit are still without positions

Seeing the location gave me insight into what it would be like to live in Pullman

I heard from the students within the program that the faculty were not reasonable or respectful to the students and that there have been serious problems with the students and their concerns not being heard by leadership.

Program flexibility

I was accepted to other graduate schools, as well as I received multiple job offers coming out of school.

International Masters students are not considered for financial assistance

Quite frankly, WSU was not at the top of my list when I first applied. After meeting with Dr. Jean-Sabin McEwin and the ChemE staff, that changed abruptly. It became one of the top two choices, competitive with my offer to Penn State. Ultimately a decision had to be made, and I chose another school, but with it was an agonizing decision that I still think about often. This effected my decision to enroll in that it made it challenging to pick from other schools

after learning how great the WSU program is.

Upon acceptance in to the sport management program, I was told that I would be required to take two undergraduate level courses before I would be allowed to begin graduate level classes. This was disappointing to learn. I did not know that was a situation that could occur as it was never mentioned anywhere in the application process or on the grad school website or the sport management website. I immediately stopped considering the WSU Sport Management program.

Received other offers.






Q10 - Were you offered an assistantship at Washington State University?

Pullman's limited employment opportunities for my family were the biggest issue. I chose a good school where the city was large enough to offer opportunity.

Working a year.

I wanted to attend, but my mother had a brain stroke and I wanted to accept the offer and differ it for one term or year. However it was not possible to differ the offer, so I decided to not attend and apply again. I am really excited about WSU, and I wish it had a deferral option at the time.

Financial offer was less at WSU

Spouse's job change lead me to change the location hence could not join WSU

I already completed my 1st yr of Grad School and had to take a medical leave of absence, not sure of when I could return. Had to apply again to begin my 2nd yr but unfortunately my medical leave is on-going at this time. My hope is to enroll again for the fall of 2017.

There were other options that I felt better suited my research interests

visa issues

The stipend is really small. When grad students are on food stamps, WSU should increase their pay. It's only ethical.

I had to help my family

I decided to pursue a different degree program not offered by WSU

I deferred admission for one year for financial reasons

Upon acceptance in to the sport management program, I was told that I would be required to take two undergraduate level courses before I would be allowed to begin graduate level classes. This was disappointing to learn. I did not know that was a situation that could occur as it was never mentioned anywhere in the application process or on the grad school website or the sport management website. I immediately stopped considering the WSU Sport Management program.

I joined the Peace Corps instead of going to graduate school straight out of my undergraduate.

I did not think it would be a good fit (too isolated at the wine campus)

I was not offered any funding

WSU was very slow processing paperwork and answering questions.

The program was not flexible enough to accomidate my academic history. I already had an MA but the program wanted me to repeat coursework equivilent to earning an MA during my PhD studies.

I made changes in my bachelor degree plan that delayed my graduation for one more semester. Therefore, i could not attend WSU for the semester I was admitted in because I have not graduated yet.

I visited three different institutions and I didn't feel like the department at WSU was where I belonged. Was a great program but it didn't feel like as good of a fit as a different institution did.

I could not stay in Pullman for the two years required to complete the program



Q14 - After you applied for admission to WSU, what correspondence did you receive?





Q15 - Would you have preferred more or less correspondence from WSU?





Sent my acceptance letter sooner than a week before needing to reply back


